A list of the strategies invoked by Admissions to manage the higher than anticipated freshmen yield are:

1. The freshmen application for fall '11 has been removed from the CollegeNet site. Freshmen applicants now require prior approval through Office of Admissions.
2. All freshmen admits who have not confirmed their admissions by the deadline of May 1 are being withdrawn by Admissions Office.
3. The Admissions Office is monitoring late deposits selectively placing some students on a "standby" list.
4. Admissions is carefully monitoring the transfer applicants for admissibility and encouraging late applicants to wait until Spring 2012 to enroll.

This higher than anticipated yield is a strong affirmation of the College's growing national reputation for quality education, student life, excellent academic support services and overall value among institutions of higher education.
